## KHEAA FAFSA Fellows named for summer support

**FRANKFORT, Ky. (July 18, 2024)** — Twenty-two college access advisors across the state have been named FAFSA Fellows by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority to help support students with their 2024-2025 financial aid applications.

The FAFSA, or the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, recently underwent a complete overhaul, and because of that, more students need help finishing applying for college aid this year.

"Our students needing some additional support before they make it to a college campus this year will be able to receive one-on-one assistance," said KHEAA Executive Director Jo Carole Ellis. "KHEAA stands ready to help anyone with financial aid questions, but our Fellows program is tasked with finding unique, creative ways of reaching students who may need help."

Recipients will each target around 50 students in their communities to assist with FAFSA completion or tasks needed to begin college in the fall of 2024 or the spring of 2025. Students can be recent high school graduates, current college students or adults returning to school with questions about financial aid. The program runs until August 9.
